



ABOUT THE COLLEGE


The history of Chhaygaon College is, indubitably, the history of higher education in the greater Chhaygaon area of South Kamrup- the homeland of heterogeneous racial elements. The inception of this institution at Chhaygaon on the 6th September, 1974 is the inevitable outcome of the unceasing effort and unitiring zeal on the part of the distinguished personalities and the patrons of learning of the area. Despite numerous setbacks, the College grew healthy with the passage of time and developed into a full-fledged co-educational institution making provision for instruction to Degree levels of Major & General Courses in Arts and Commerce streams. The Arts stream came under the deficit system of grants-in-aid of the Govt. of Assam with effect from 01/02/1985 and is permanently affiliated to Gauhati University. The Commerce stream which was introduced later is affiliated to Gauhati University from the session 1989-90. The College, registered under U.G.C. 2(f)/12(B) runs the Higher Secondary Section in Arts & Commerce with permanent recognition of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

In view of the exploration and explosion of knowledge and the innovations in the transmission of knowledge, the College authority has done a great deal in its attempt to sustain and enhance quality in higher education. LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE:

The College is ideally situated at an easily accessible location at Chhaygaon- a place that can boast of its ethnic and cultural diversities and also of the rich heritage to which Chandika Devalaya and Chandor Merghar stand as silent testimonial. The College stands beside the National Highway No. 37 at a distance of about 40 kms. west of Gauhati University and about 30kms. from the Gopinath Bordoloi Airport.

THE CAMPUS:

The College is built on an area of about 15 bighas of land under the Chhaygaon Revenue circle. The site is grand with luxuriant green fields and shady trees free from the pollution of the crowded environment and it includes one RCC buildings, two semi RCC buildings, two Assam type buildings, a large auditorium, a gymnasium, a comfortable canteen and a medium-sized playground inside the large compound. The campus maintains security all around with walls and iron gates to prevent unwanted entries.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE TIS REQUIREMENTS & CONDITIONS

- (A) The College has a transparent admission process executed strictly on merit through entrance test, interview and academic record. Students seeking admission into different courses should apply in prescribed form which may be collected along with the Prospectus from the College office. The candidates are required to fill the relevant columns carefully and enclose all attested copies of relevant testimonials while submitting the forms to the College Office on or before the due date. Incomplete and late application form, wrong options of electives will be summarily rejected.
- (B) The selection of candidates for admission is done by a Selection Committee constituted by the Principal of the College. The committee prepares the list of the selected ones and displays it on the College Notice Board well ahead of the admission dates. The selected candidates are required to get themselves admitted on the dates as notified by producing the following documents in original.
 - 1. Mark sheet of the qualifying examination
 - 2. H.S.L.C. admit card
 - 3. Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
 - 4. Gap certificate if necessary (For students passing the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year)
 - 5. Caste certificate (For SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates). Provisional certificate will not be accepted
 - 6. Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities (if and where necessary)
- (C) Seats are limited both in H.S. & TDC courses
- (D) Reservation of seats is as per rule
- (E) Selection for Major is subject to the approval of the HOD concerned. Entrance test is conducted
- (F) All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of GU/AHSEC
- (G) A candidate is permitted to seek admission only for one programme in a given academic session

- (H) The College authority decides all other matters not covered by the above clauses relating to admission & selection
- (I) Violation of the rules results in cancellation of admission and forfeiture of admission fees
- (J) Notices regarding admission are displayed on the College Notice Board in due course

EVALUATION & EXAMINATION

The College makes arrangements for overall performance of the students through regular assessment. The evaluation and examination process comprises Assignments, Unit Test, Terminal Examination and Test. Students are required to sit for all these examinations failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the examinations conducted by AHSEC/G.U.

(GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations are to be strictly followed by the students-

(A) Attendance in class is compulsory. Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% classes held in one academic year, failing which he/she will be declared NON-COLLEGIATE. A student failing to attend a minimum of 50% of the classes will not be eligible to sit for the final Examination.

- (B) A student must not abstain from attending SEMINARS, MEETINGS & other functions in the College.
- (C) A student must carry the identity card issued by the College authority in the College premises and must produce it if and when necessary. He/She must surrender the identity card at the time of receiving pass/transfer certificate.
- (D) Use of indecent language, ungentlemanly conduct, ragging in any form, teasing, showing disregard to the teachers and office staff, violation of the examination rules, damage to College property, will definitely invite stern disciplinary action.
- (E) Alcoholic consumption in the College campus, loitering in front of the class rooms or in the corridors are strictly forbidden.
- (F) No society or organization can be formed in the College nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the College premises without the prior permission of the College authority or the Principal of the College. Wall writing is strictly prohibited.
- (G) All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal of the College.

 The College tries its best to maintain peace and harmony among the students and wants each and every student to uphold and preserve this tradition.

and a certificate showing record of attendance form the head of the departments concerned. The student has to pay Rs. 15/- for a Transfer certificate and Rs. 10/- for a Pass/ Character certificate.

FACILITIES & FEATURES

Library:

Housed on the north side of the campus, the College library has a rich collection of books and periodicals with separate study spaces for the teachers and the students. The College authority has, in the meantime, taken ambitious schemes to bring about a major change through its development. The library has been computerised with internet facilities. Steps have been initiated to provide more facilities like reprography, book bank etc. at the earliest convenience. The library remains open for six hours from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M. on all working

days. Students and teachers have open access and can borrow books for 15 days from the date of issue. A fine is imposed upon the defaulting students. The final examination question papers of AHSEC & GU are also available at the library at a nominal cost. The members of the library staff are always ready to help the readers.

Departmental Common Room:

The College authority has undertaken steps to provide each teaching department of the College with a well-equipped common room.

College Auditorium:

A well-planned and well-ventilated auditorium with a capacity to accommodate about one thousand students provides facilities for students' activities, meetings, conference etc.

Common Rooms for Boys and Girls:

The College provides separate common rooms for boys and girls with facilities for recreation.

Insurance Coverage:

The college has been providing Insurance coverage of Rs. 10,000/- each for all students for one year at a single premium of Rs. 20/- to be collected at the time of admission.

Hostel:

The College provides hostel accommodation for boys in a rented building, if necessary. The construction of a two-storeyed women's hostel under UGC scheme is at full swing and the college will be able to provide accommodation at least 35 girls soon.

Sports:

The students of the College are encouraged to understand the need for physical fitness and the College provides a multi-gym 16-station complete set for the purpose. The young learners are stimulated in the sphere of athletics, yoga and sports. The College has managed to obtain financial assistance to the tune of Rs. 3,00,000/- from Oil India Limited for enhancement of sports facilities. It is noteworthy that the students who have represented in sports field at national level and state level awardees will receive liberal financial assistance.

The College Canteen:

The cosy College canteen supplies fresh food to teacher, students and non teaching staff of the College at reasonable rate.

The College Magazine:

The College issues its magazine "KALAHI" every year regularly and, it includes contributions from the students and the staff members. In addition to that, a wall magazine published periodically encourages the students for literary achievements and exposure.

Students' Union:

Chhaygaon College Students' Union is constituted annually as per rules provided in the constitution of the Union. The Union plays an important role in the College by organising different students' activities, competitions, functions and festivals in co-operation with the College authority. The membership to the Union is compulsory for every student.

National Service Scheme:

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Chhaygaon College develops a sense of social responsibility in students through a variety of community service and welfare activities like voluntary health service, child welfare, adult literacy, relief programme, environment awareness etc. both inside and outside the College.

Bharat Scouts and Guides:

The College has introduced 'Bharat Scouts and Guides' to inculcate the spirit of discipline, physical fitness & character-building in the students.

Career Counselling & Information Guidance:

Chhaygaon College provides career counselling and information guidance to create awareness about career prospects, employment etc. for the greater benefit of the student community. Resource persons on career counselling and entrepreneurship development are invited for guidance and interaction.

Academic Society & Students Activities:

A few Associations in the College like 'Social Science Study Forum', 'Sahitya Chora' undertake and carry out academic/co-curricular activities like seminar, extension, lecture, field study, survey etc. with the involvement of the teachers and the students with a view to creating an academic cultural atmoshphere of general nature. All these nurture the students' emerging personalities to become full-faceted.

Students' Aid Fund:

The College has established a Students' Aid Fund to extend financial help to the poor but meritorious and physically handicapped students.

Scholarship:

Students are awarded the following scholarships as prescribed by the government of Assam— (a) Merit Scholarship, (b) SC/ST/OBC/MOBC scholarship.

- 2. A graduate with the Bachelor of Communication & Journalism (BJG) degree of Gauhati University or PGDJMC under IDOL,GU may be admitted for the courses of Previous Module or allowed Lateral entry into the Final Module directly.

Post Graduate Diploma Programmes

The Post Graduate Diploma programmes under IDOL, G..U. are open to any graduate from any recognized Indian or Foreign Universities/Institutes in any stream. Candidates who are pursuing another degree course in this University are also eligible for simultaneous admission.

DURATION:

Master Degree Programmes

The Master Degree programmes under IDOL,G..U. shall be of two years duration (two academic years) and divided into two parts viz. Previous and Final year.

PG Diploma Programmes

The PG Diploma programmes under IDOL,G.U. shall be of one year duration.

FEES STRUCTURE & MODE OF PAYMENT:

FEES STRUCTURE FOR M.A./M.SC./M.COM./MCJ PROGRAMMES

Total fees for all Master Degree programmes shall be Rs. 10,000/- (Rs. Ten Thousand only) i.e. Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five Thousand only) per annuam inclusive of Admission Fee, Councelling Fee, Course Material Fee. Library Fee, Postal charge and Examination fee etc.

Fees are payable either in one/two installments or in four equal installments of Rs. 2500/-.

FEE STRUCTURE FOR PGDSMM, PGDHRM, PGDBM, PGDBFS, PGDIM:

The total fees for the PG Diploma Courses in Management shall be Rs. 6,000/- (Rupees Six Thosand only) inclusive of Admission Fee, Course Material Fee, Library Fee, postal Charge and the Examination Fee etc. The Fees are payable either in one instalment or in two equal

instalments of Rs. 3000/- (Ruppes Three Thousand Only) each.

FEE STRUCTURE FOR PGDJMC:





