

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

COLLEGE PROFILE

Chhaygaon College a trusted name for thirty seven years is a premier institution of South Kamrup, provides a unique brand of holistic education to nearly 2200 students who hails from in an around Chhaygaon area.

The college was inaugurated in 1974 on 6th September and was the outcome of insatiable thirst for knowledge of the eminent personalities and patrons of learning of this locality who struck to their object with iron will and strong determination to provide excellent educational facilities in higher education with extra emphasis on sports and culture.

The college is situated on the bank of the ever flowing Kalahi river, beside National Highway No. 37, at a distance of about 40kms, west of Guwahati and about 30kms, from the Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport, and 35 kms, approximately from Gauhati University on a vast sprawling land, amid lush greenery. Chhaygaon is a place that can state with excessive pride of its ethnic and rich cultural diversities. The Chandika Devalaya and Chandar Merghar has been a mute observer to everything happening or going on in the vast Chhaygaon area and its suburbs.

The college, now registered under UGC-2(f) 12(B), also runs the Higher Secondary section in arts and commerce. From its beginning as an arts college it has grown in eminence to a full-fledged Degree college imparting higher education in arts and commerce.

The Arts stream was brought into the Deficit system of Grant-in-Aid of the Govt. of Assam in 1985, and the Commerce stream was affiliated to GU in the year 1989-90. Govt. concurrence is accorded upto TDC Part II standard general course in commerce stream vide letter no. AHE 160/2004/167(A) dt. 04.07.2005.

- i) The library has photostat machine which can be used at a concessional rate both by teachers and students.
- ii) Computer with Internet facility: The suers of the college library can make use of the internet facility with payment of nominal amount.
- iii) Reading room: There is a reading room where 50 readers can read at a time.

Rules of the Library:

i) Strict discipline and complete silence is to be maintained inside the library.

- ii) The students must come to the library for borrowing/returning of books and reading/taking notes.
- iii) The students are not allowed enter the library with their bags and belongings. They must leave them in place earmarked for these materials.
- iv) The library remains open for six hours from 10am to 4pm on all working days.
- v) Students and teachers can borrow books for 15 days from the date of issue.
- vi). The students will have to compensate for loss or damage of the books issued from the library at the current market price.
- vii) The student will have to return the library books borrowed by them before filling up the examination form, otherwise they will not be allowed to fill up their forms.
- viii) The main aim of the library is to help the students by providing reference books. Hence, emphasis is placed on the collection of reference books etc. They are suggested to manage their own text books.

SEMESTER SYSTEM

The College will introduce semester system in three year degree course from the academic session 2011-12 which have been approved by the academic council.

The university is introducing semester from this academic session. Under the semester system, students will have to appear for two sets of examination every year at a gap of six months, and will complete their graduation after taking six examinations in three years. Besides the six examinations there would be frequent internal and external academic assessment of students in the new system. In the semester system students will not only be graded by their performance in the examination, but also on the overall effort in the entire session.

There shall be six semesters covering three calender year. The total marks of six semesters will be in between 2400-3000. The evaluation process of student's performance will be based on internal evaluation 20% marks and external evaluation based on 80% marks. Internal evaluation will be done for each semester through two sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars and library works. A student may be allowed or not allowed to repeat or betterment, the decision will be taken as per University Rule.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

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Medium of Instruction: As per AHSEC/GU rules and notification.

- The College has a transparent admission process executed strictly on merit through entrance test, interview and academic record. Students seeking admission into different courses should apply in prescribed from which may be collected along with the Prospectus from the College. The candidates are required to fill the relevant columns carefully and enclose all attested copies of relevant testimonials while submitting the forms to the College Office on or before the due date. Incomplete and late application form, wrong options of electives will be summarily rejected.
- The selection of candidates for admission is done by a Selection Committee constituted by the Principal of the College. The committee prepares the list of the selected ones and displays it on the College Notice Board well ahead of the admission dates. The selected candidates are required to get themselves admitted on the dates as notified by producing the following documents in original.
 - 1. Marksheet of the qualifying examination
 - 2. H.S.L.C. admit card
 - 3. Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
 - 4. Gap certificate if necessary (for students passing the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year)
 - 5. Caste certificate (for SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates). Provisional certificate will not be accepted.
 - 6. Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities (if and where necessary)
- Seats are limited both in H.S. & TDC courses.
- Reservation of seats is as per rule.
- Selection for Major is subject to the approval of the HOD concerned. (entrance will be conducted if necessary)
- All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of GU/AHSEC.
- A candidate is permitted to seek admission only for one programme in a given academic session.
- The College authority decides all other matter not covered by the above clauses relating to admission & selection.
- Violation of the rules results in cancellation of admission and forfeiture of admission fees.
- Notice regarding admission are displayed on the College Notice Board in due course.

INTERNAL EVALUATION & EXAMINATION

- A) The College makes arrangements for overall performance of the students through regular assessment. The evaluation and examination process comprises Assignments, Unit Test, Terminal Examination and Test. Students are required to sit for all these examinations failling which they will not be allowed to appear in the examinations conducted by AHEC/GU.
- B) Internal Assessment: The Gauhati University has introduced Internal Assessment of students of TDC classes. Under this system, for each paper of 100 marks, the University will conduct an examination for 90 marks and the remaining 10 marks will be allocated by the college on the basis of Internal Assessment.

In the Internal Assessment of a students, there will be a 40% weightage on attendance (students with less than 75% attendance will not awarded any marks for attendance). The remaining 60% weightage in the Internal Assessment will be based on a student's performance in the Unit Tests.

GENERAL RULES AND PUNCTUALITIES

The following rules and regulations are to be strictly followed by the students

• Attendance in class in compulsory. Each students is required to attend a minimum of 75% classes held in one academic year, failing which he/she will be declared NON-COLLEGIATE. A student failing to attend a minimum of 50% of the classes will not be eligible to sit for the final examination.

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- A student must not abstain from attending SEMINARS, MEETINGS & other functions in the College.
- A student must carry the identity card issued by the college authority in the college premises and must produce it if and when necessary. He/she must surrender the identity card at the time of receiving pass/transfer certificate.
- Use of indecent language, ungentlemanly conduct, ragging in any form, teasing, showing disregard to the teachers and office staff, violation of the examination rules, damage to College property will definitely invite stern disciplinary action.
- Alcoholic consumption in the college campus, loitering in front of the class rooms or in the corridors are strictly forbidden.
- No society or organization can be formed in the college nor shall any person be invited to address
 a meeting in the college premises without the prior permission of the college authority or the Principal of
 the college. Wall writing is strictly prohibited.
 - All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal of the college.
- N.B.- The College tries its best to maintain peace and harmony among the students and wants each and every student to uphold and preserve this tradition.

COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

Application to the Principal for transfer certificate on valid ground must be accompanied by clearance certificate from :

- (a) College Office
- (b) Librarian

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(c) Vice-President (CCSU)

and a certificate showing record of attendance from the head of the departments concerned. The student has to pay Rs. 15/- for a Transfer Certificate and Rs. 10/- for a Pass/Character Certificate.

FACILITIES

Auditorium:

A well-planned and well-ventilated auditorium with a capacity to accommodate about one thousand students provides facilities for students' activities, meetings, conference etc.

Common rooms for Boys and Girls:

The College has separate common rooms for boys and girls with recreational facilities.

Hostel:

The College provides hostel for Girls which is under construction within the college campus.

The College Canteen:

The cosy College canteen supplies fresh and delicious food to teacher, students and non teaching staff of the College at reasonable rate.

Wall Magazine, and College Magazine:

The College brings out a yearly magazine 'Kalahi' where teachers and students contribute articles, stories, poems, sketches etc. In addition to that a wall magazine is published periodically to encourage the students for literary exposure.

Sports:

The College promotes and encourages both outdoor and indoor games.

Students' Day Home:

The College has its own students' day home where students gather and keep themselves busy in co-curricular activities.

Students' Union:

Chhaygaon College Students' Union is constituted annually as per rules provided in the constitution of the Union. The Union plays an important role in the College by organising different students' activities, competitions, functions and festivals in co-operation with the College authority. The membership to the Union is compulsory for every student.

NSS (National Service Scheme):

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Chhaygaon College develops a sense of social responsibility in students through a variety of community service and welfare activities like voluntary health service, child welfare, adult literacy, relief programme, environment awareness etc. both inside and outside the College.

Bharat Scouts and Guides:

The College has introduced 'Bharat Scouts and Guides' to inculcate the spirit of discipline, physical fitness and character-building in the students.

Career Counselling and Information Guidance:

Chhaygaon College provides career counselling and information guidance to create awareness about career prospects, employment etc. for the greater benefit of the student community. Resource persons on career counselling and enterpreneurship development are invited for guidance and interaction.

Academic Society and Students Activities:

A few Associations in the College like 'Social Study Forum', 'Sahitya Chora' undertake and carry out academic/co-curricular activities like seminar, extension, lecture, field study, survey etc. with the involvement of the teacher and the students with a view a to creating an academic cultural atmosphere of general nature. It fosters the organising ability and love for team-work in students.

Students' Aid Fund:

The College has a Students' Aid Fund to extend financial help to the poor but meritorious and physically handicapped students.

ACADEMIC & CO-CURRICULAR ACHIEVEMENTS

Consistent endeavour has always ensured the desired result in so far as academic achievements are concerned. Brilliant results have brought laurels to the College when two HS candidates and three TDC candidate secured ranks. Five students from the college win medals (Gold-2, Silver-2 and Bronze-1) for distinction in different competitions in the Inter-College Youth Festival/2007-08, Gauhati University. 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
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
















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
