Chhaygaon College is a trusted name for long 40 years and is a premier institution which provides a unique band of holistic education to nearly 3,500 students who hail from in and around greater Chhaygaon area- a homeland of heterogeneous racial elements.



(A student shall be eligible to offer one vocational subject in lieu of one elective subject).

Regulations of TDC for Semester System

- TDC shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The schedule for Semester System shall be as shown below.
 - (a) First, Third and Fifth Semester: August 1 December 31. (including Examinations)
 - (b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester: January 1 June 30 (including Examinations)
 - (c) Semester Break: July 1 July 31.
- Students performance should be monitored throughout the Semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical course. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following.

Internal Evaluation: 10/15/20/25 Marks External Evaluation: 40/60/80/75 Marks

- Internal Evaluation should be based on two sessional examinations. Home Assignments, seminars and library work in each Semester.
- External evaluation should be through a final examination at the end of the Semester.
- The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and that in each practical paper is 40%.
- 6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
- A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - First semester with the regular third Semester Examination.
 - b. Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester Examination
 - c. Third Semester with regular Fifth Semester examination.
 - d. Fourth Semester with regular Sixth Semester examination.
- 8) A student may be allowed to "repeat" any one of the theory papers in the First. Second, Third and Fourth Semester, and may be allowed for "betterment" of marks in one paper in the Fifth Semester, provided the student secures less than 45% marks in the paper.
- 9) No "repeat"/"betterment" shall be allowed in the practical examinations in any semester.
- 10) A Student must pass all his examinations, including 'repeat' and 'betterment' chances, within five years from the date of admission to the First Semester course. A student will get a maximum of three chances to clear a particular Semester.
- 11) In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events the matter may be placed in th appropriate Committee of the University for amicable settlement.
- 12. Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment there would be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any subject.
- 13) For any matter not covered under this Regulation for Semester System, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) should be applicable.

Note:The exact date of the sessional examination shall be fixed by the concerned teachers/colleges and that of the final semester examination by the OE/GU. The Controller of Examinations would announce the results of the final examinations. Admissions will be given by following University Rules.

Syllabus and Course Structure under Semester system

- The syllabus for each paper should be divided into modules or units. Each unit should be assigned marks (Preferably equal marks for each unit) so that the question papers of the final semester examination cover the entire syllabus.
- 2. The minimum total marks in a under graduate course of 6 semester should be (preferably) in between 2400-3000. Due to different nature of subjects, with practicals or otherwise, the individual stream may make the final decision regarding the total marks.
- 3. In the sixth semester of the honours course there must be at least one compulsory paper where the students are given the opportunity to apply their knowledge. The course may be so designed that student's creativity is encouraged. This could be a small academic project, an advanced level practical work including literature survey on a topic, field/survey work or any other work which may induce creativity among the students.

The students must submit two copies of the Project Work prepared in the Format of a Ph.D or M.Phil. thesis. The students will have to defend the work before an external examination and Internal Board comprising of three teachers including the supervisor/guide.

Admission procedure, its requirements & conditions

- (A) The College has a transparent admission process executed strictly on merit through entrance test, interview and academic record. Students seeking admission into different courses should apply in prescribed form which may be collected along with the Prospectus from the College office. The candidates are required to fill the relevant columns carefully and enclose all attested copies of relevant testimonials while submitting the forms to the College Office on or before the due date. Incomplete and late application form, wrong options of electives will be summarily rejected.
- (B) The selection of candidates for admission is done by a Selection Committee constituted by the Principal of the College. The committee prepares the list of the selected ones and displays it on the College Notice Board well ahead of the admission dates. The selected candidates are required to get themselves admitted on the dates as notified by producing the following documents in original
- 1. Mark sheet of the qualifying examination
- 2. H.S.L.C. admit card
- 3. Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended
- 4. Gap certificate if necessary (For students passing the qualifying examinations earlier than the current year)
- 5. Caste certificate (For SC/ST/OBC/MOBC candidates). Provisional certificate will not be accepted
- 6. Certificate of proficiency in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities (if and where necessary)
- (C) Seats are limited both in H.S. & TDC courses
- (D) Reservation of seats is as per rule
- (E) Selection for Major is subject to the approval of the HOD concerned. Entrance test is conducted
- (F) All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of GU/AHSEC
- (G) A candidate is permitted to seek admission only for one programme in a given academic session
- (H) The College authority decides all other matters not covered by the above clauses relating to admission & selection
- (I) Violation of the rules results in cancellation of admission and forfeiture of admission fees
- (J) Notices regarding admission are displayed on the College Notice Board in due course

INTERNAL EXAMINATION & EVALUATION

The College makes arrangements for overall performance of the students through regular assessment. The evaluation and examination process comprises Assignments, Unit Test, Sessional Examination and Test. Students are required to sit for all these examination failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the examinations conducted by AHSEC/G.U.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations are to be strictly followed by the students-

- (A) Attendance in class is compulsory. Each student is required to attend a minimum of 75% classes held in one academic year, failing which the College shall have the right to take necessary action.
- (B) A student must not abstain from attending SEMINARS, MEETINGS & other functions in the College.
- (C) A student must carry the identity card issued by the College authority in the College premises and must produce it if and when necessary. He/She must surrender the identity card at the time of receiving pass/transfer certificate.
- (D) Use of indecent language, ungentlemanly conduct, ragging in any form, teasing, showing disregard to the teachers and office staff, violation of the examination rules, damage to College property, will definitely invite stern disciplinary action.
- (E) Consumption of alchohol, tobacco; smoking cigarette in the College campus, loitering in front of the classrooms or in the corridors
- (F) No society or organization can be formed in the College nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the College premises without the prior permission of the College authority or the Principal of the College.
- G) Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycles locked in the newly built parking shade located in the south-west corner of the college campus area at their own risk.
- H) Students should see the Notice Board regularly.
- I) All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal of the College.

The College tries its best to maintain peace and harmony among the students and wants each and every student to uphold and preserve this tradition.

College transfer certificate

Application to the Principal for transfer certificate on valid ground must be accompanied by clearance certificate from-

- (a) College Office

and a certificate showing record of attendance from the head of the department concerned. The student has to pay Rs. 100/- for a Transfer certificate and Rs. 50/- for a Pass/Character certificate. The College office may require a few days to process the application for Transfer certificate.

College resources & Key Features

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

Housed in the first floor of the Administrative Building of the College on the north side of the campus, the central library of the College caters to the need of a large number of readers comprising students and faculty members with a rapidly increasing collection of text books, reference books, rare books, general books, encyclopaedia, reports, journals, special collections, newspapers etc. Books are catalogued and classified as per DDC method.

Library Resources

- 1. The library has been computerised with internet and photo copying facitilites accessible to students and teachers at concessional rates.
- 2. The library provides seperate study spaces for the teachers and the students.
- 3. The library consists around 15,000 books on different genres of study.
- 4. The library facilitates question papers of G.U. and AHSEC Examinations of the previous years.





Library Rules

The College Library rules are framed in keeping with the University Library rules.

- 1. Students are issued library cards and a student can borrow a book for 10 (ten) days from the date of issue. A fine is imposed upon the defaulting students.
- 2. The library remains open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- 3. Silence is compulsory inside the library and reading rooms.

Departmental Common Room

The College authority provides each teaching department of the College with a well-equipped common room. Each department has a self arranged departmental library.

Common Rooms for Boys and Girls

The College provides separate common rooms for boys and girls with facilities for recreation.

College Auditorium

The 'Champakjyoti Prekshagriho', a well-planned, well-equipped, well-ventilated, soundproof and eco-friendly auditorium with a capacity to accommodate about one thousand students provides facilities for students' activities, meetings, conference etc. This beautifully decorated auditorium is considered as one of the most ideal and attractive auditoriums in the state..



College Guest House

In the eastern part of the campus and adjacent to the auditorium, the college has a comfortable, air-conditioned Guest House with all modern amenities.



Sports facilities & Gym

The College has facilities for both outdoor and indoor games. Keeping the welfare of the students' physical and mental health in view, an Indoor Stadium has been constructed in the south-west corner of the college premises. This ideally prepared stadium, covering an area of 40×30 sq.mtrs., extends to the sportsmen an ideal practising ground and accommodates 2 (two) badminton courts, 2 (two) table-tennis boards and also a multi-gym having 16-station complete set. The gym is operated by an efficient and well-trained instructor. Besides, the young learners are stimulated in the sphere of athletics, yoga and sports. Moreover, active process is in operation for rennovating the existing playground with additional facility of flood-lights.

Laboratories and Teaching Aids

The College facilitates the students with improved, well-equipped laboratories for smooth and smart conduct of experiments in the departments of Education and Computer Science.

In addition, students are provided with opportunity to harness effective classroom teaching using modern facilities like over-head projector, sound amplifier and so on.



Hostel Facilities

Hostel accommodation for the students within the College campus is offered by the College. The existing three-storeyed Girls' Hostel is well equipped with all accommodation facilities. The borders remained under the care and tutelage of the Superintendent who supervises them staying in the same building. Amid indoor and outdoor sports facilities the boarders enjoy a pleasant stay in the hostel

Keeping the need of our students in view, the College has facilitated 45 boys with hostel accommodation as a temporary arrangement which runs under close supervision of a full time superintendent.





The College Cycle-Stand

The newly-constructed cycle-stand can afford around 500 cycles at a time. This beautifully roofed cycle-stand adds extra colour to the facilities for the students.



Innovated Block-System for the Departments

Each department of the college has been designed in an innovative way where the departments are arranged in blocks. The departments are performing teaching in the classrooms within their respective blocks.






The College Canteen


Flamboyant Features




